Time to Celebrate!

Sunday 8th September marked the end of a project that had started some three years previously when we learned that the church spire was in a very poor condition and there were alarming photographs showing damage.

A development group (PDG) was set up to raise funds: from church members and church charities. Once estimates for the work were received it became apparent that it looked impossible to meet the enormous cost and so after discussion and prayer it was decided to apply to the Heritage Lottery Fund.

THE FIRST MIRACLE was that among our congregation were folk with the skills and knowledge in making such an application.

THE SECOND MIRACLE was that the application was successful and a sum of money to complete the work was promised.

An architect, contractor and scaffolder were appointed and the work started.

Later a suggestion was made to try a second application to the Fund. This concerned the roofs and guttering over the side aisles which, for many years, had leaked rainwater into the church.

THE THIRD MIRACLE was that a second large sum was approved to cover the additional work.

Everything was completed on time, within budget and safely!

After such a successful celebration we retired to the Hall for delicious cakes and a hot drink.
