In September we start a new school year and restart many activities in church which have been on hold during the summer, It is also a time of looking forward to all that God has in store for us, as we look to having a new vicar in this coming season of our church. September 28th from 9.30-1pm is Vision Saturday when the whole church is invited to come to talk and pray about the way ahead.

The steeple stands proudly (and safely at last) 140ft tall and a target was set to gather 140 memories for the Heritage database — the spire being a symbol of our church in the community. Helen Richards, who became our inspirational heritage worker, confirmed that the target had been reached. Most of these memories are now on the website www.worksopspire.org but there is still room for more.

Speaking to people present three main reasons for being there emerged: Church members helping anencouraging, others with an interest in local history or sharing memories with others and some who just enjoy coffee and company.

If TV magazine type articles are more your bag, then try **TBN UK** (Trinity Broadcasting Network) on Freeview channel 66. Discussions, Christian music and Bible teachings are available 24/7. 




