Phill Kicks, one of our churchwardens, writes....

Soon after Jess and I were elected as Churchwardens we were given the report on the state of the church spire which was in a dangerous condition and we already knew we had a leaky roof!

We applied to the National Lottery Heritage Fund and this led to many hours of laborious and time-consuming work, reading documents (which proved invaluable in the long run) and completing application forms (10,000 words!). Six faculties (Cofe Planning Permission) were applied for and, thanks to our dedicated Team working through a series of special milestones, the work began in June 2023.

Once the fancy scaffolding was around the spire (see pic above) and work started, the plan and timeline changed due to additional work.

We also had to contend with the weather and additional

costs, which is where the indepth reading was helpful in bartering down the costs.

We finally completed the spire in January 24.

In November/December 23 funds were not available for the roof, so we approached the NLHF again who set us a task with 24hrs to complete which we managed with Jess typing and myself dictating due to a damaged hand. This resulted in an additional grant of over £12Ok so the work on the roof could go ahead. This began in February 24 and was completed in June 24.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the great team supporting me as the Project Manager, the generosity and continual prayer support from all our church members.

We spent £385,152.00 for the spire and roof. An overspend of £9550.52. A 2.5% overspend is within the project contingency.

God is good and has blessed us all the way throughout this amazing Project.


Hot and cold drinks are available throughout the mornings for adults and children. After snacks we have singing time and then bubbles, balls and hoops.
